CODE 1: WHAT'S THIS ?

Write the numbers corresponding to each picture in the correct order and you will have the perfect combination of the first padlock (*cadenas*) !

1 st picture	2 nd picture	3 rd picture	4 th picture	5 th picture

CODE 2: DO YOU SPEAK CHRISTMAS ?

'OUTSIDE' WORDS

The first letter of the combination (*combinaison*) is the most repeated vowel (*voyelle la plus répétée*) of the words (*mots*).

The second letter of the combination is the third letter of the third word.

'IN THE LIVING-ROOM' WORDS

The first letter of the second word is the third letter of the combination.

The fourth letter of the combination is the first consonant (*consonne*) of the last word.

'IN THE KITCHEN' WORDS

The last letter of the combination is a vowel present in the first and second words, not in the third word.

CODE 3: WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT CHRISTMAS ?

How many people (*personnes*) do you need to pull a cracker ?

The number is the first digit (*chiffre*) of the combination.

When were the first Christmas cards created ?

Add the numbers to get the second digit of the combination.

Christmas trees have a lot of tinsels and crackers.

Right (1) or wrong (2) ?

The number corresponding to the correct answer is the third digit of the combination.

Sending Christmas cards is a new tradition in England and in the U.S.A.

Right (1) or wrong (2) ?

The number corresponding to the correct answer is the last digit of the combination.

CODE 4: MAKE YOUR OWN CHRISTMAS CRACKER

Picture 1. What is the English for '(dé)couper' ?

The first letter of the verb is the first letter of the combination.

Picture 2. What is the English for 'ajouter' ?

The letter repeated twice is the second letter of the combination.

Picture 3. What is the English for 'colle' ?

The last letter of the word is the third letter of the combination.

Picture 4. What is the English for 'ficelle' ?

The only vowel of this word is the fourth letter of the combination.

Picture 5. The last letter of the combination is the most repeated vowel of the sentence (*la phrase*).
