1. The Prime Minister works at **10, Downing Street**. If you are lucky, you can see VIPs come and go.
2. Do you like exotic food ? There are many Chinese restaurants in this lively quarter called **Chinatown**.
3. You can visit **Buckingham Palace**, the Queen's London residence or just come and watch the changing of the guard.
4. **The Houses of Parliament** include the Commons and the House of Lords. To visit the clocktower **Big Ben**, you need to be sporty – there are 340 steps to the bell which weighs 13 tons!
5. **Westminster Abbey** is where all royal coronations, weddings and funerals have taken place since 1066.
6. **The Tower of London** was built by the Norman William the Conqueror in 1066. The Tower was a fortress and a palace. In the past, it was also a prison. Now it is a museum where you can admire the Crown Jewels
7. Go for a walk, cycle, swim, relax, row a boat or roller-blade in the largest London park, **Hyde Park**.
8. **Tower Bridge** (built 1886–1894) is a combined bascule and suspension bridge over the River Thames.
9. To mark the Millenium (Year 2000), a gigantic wheel (135 metres high) was built on the south bank of the Thames. For a magical view over London, buy a ticket, and go on a ride in one of the luxurious capsule of **the London Eye**.
